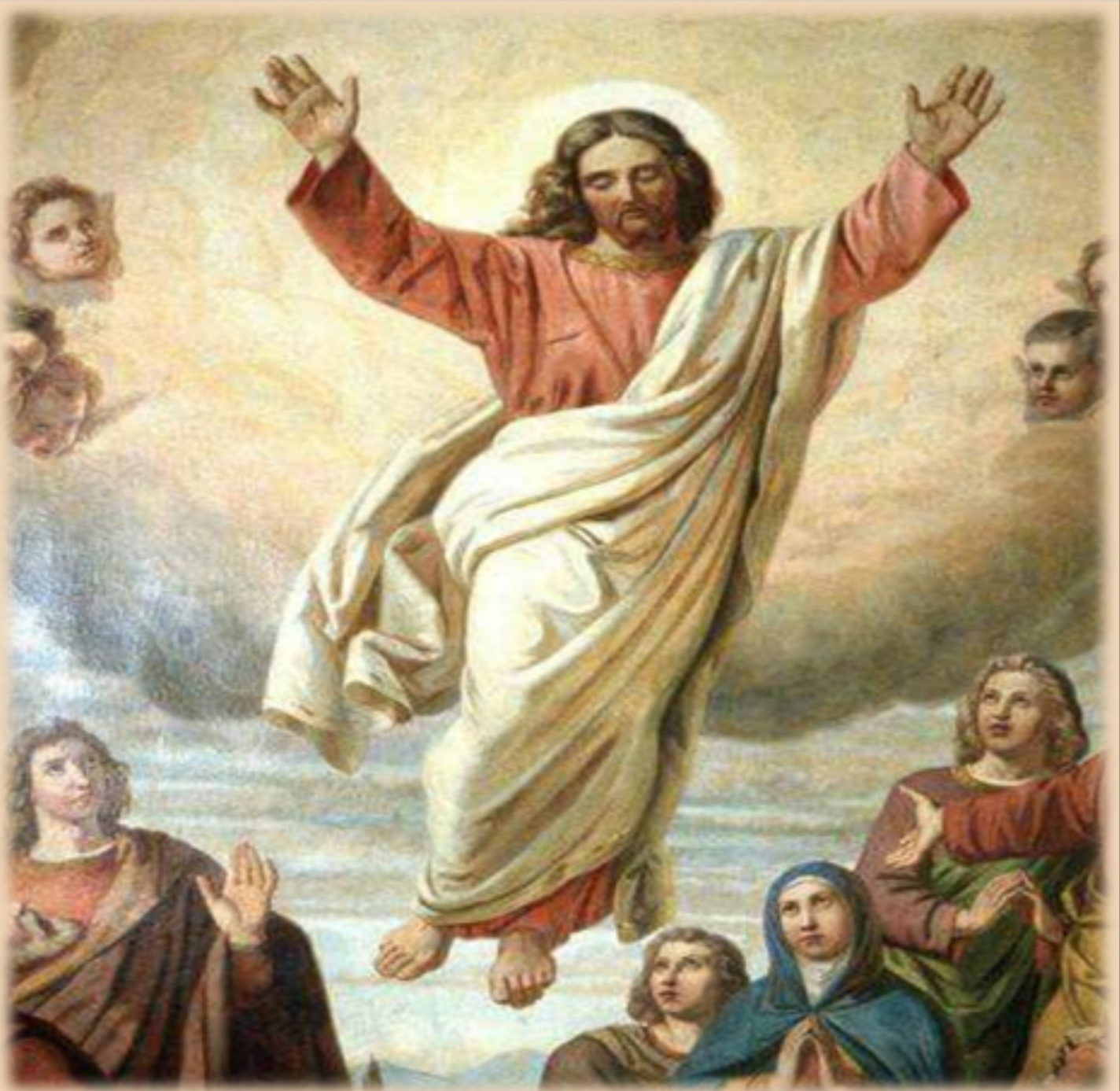

Reflections from the Heart

“The disciples went to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them.” At one time or another, most of us have heard the command: “go to your room.” This is a direct order given to us as a result of not fulfilling what was asked of us; which is to be good, to listen, to be obedient, to do as we are told. But when Jesus orders us to go to the mountain, he is asking us go to the inner room of our hearts and pray to the Father. It is not a punishment but a privilege and a blessing. Jesus extends an invitation to each one of us to experience more fully, in prayer, moments of profound intimacy, moments of deep peace, moments of divine consolation, quiet moments to share our thoughts, our praise, our joys, our difficulties with God. In prayer, we fulfill the command to love and experience God’s love for us. I think about this precious gift of prayer and the grace to be able to place ourselves in the presence of God; to be in Holy Communion with God in the silence of our hearts. What a lovely thought; what an amazing gift. It is then we can ask God to be with us, to receive from us, to take from us, to fill us, to forgive us, to heal us, to love us, to look upon us and be with us. What a lovely thought. I contemplate how the Virgin Mary invites us to pray. Her heart is always open to God; she remains forever available to him. Her heart and arms wide open to God; so receptive, so obedient to God and his holy will. I love when our Blessed Mother commands us to do whatever Jesus tells us to do. It is out of love for God and love for us that Mary orders us; it is for our own good. Her very words and actions encourage us to remain open, attentive, and receptive to God’s gracious gifts and his holy will. I think about the times when I was asked to pray; the times I was forced to go to that inner room in my heart; the times I was asked to be vulnerable and obedient to God’s command. It is those times that I felt God’s love and healing presence the most. The times I was most dependent on him. The times I was most susceptible to his grace. The times I felt most free and one with God. So I order you, right now! – “go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father.” It is for your own good! Fr. Ivan

Es entonces que podemos pedir a Dios que esté con nosotros, que reciba de nosotros, que tome de nosotros, que nos llene, que nos perdone, que nos sane, que nos ame, que nos mire y esté con nosotros. Que hermoso pensamiento. Contemplo como la Virgen María nos invita a orar. Su corazón siempre está abierto a Dios; ella permanece por siempre a su disposición. Su corazón y sus brazos abiertos a Dios; tan receptiva, tan obediente a Dios y a su santa voluntad. Amo cuando nuestra Madre Bendita nos manda a hacer lo que Jesús nos dice. Es por amor a Dios y amor a nosotros que María nos ordena; es por nuestro propio bien. Sus propias palabras y acciones nos animan a permanecer abiertos, atentos y receptivos a los clementes dones de Dios y a su santa voluntad. 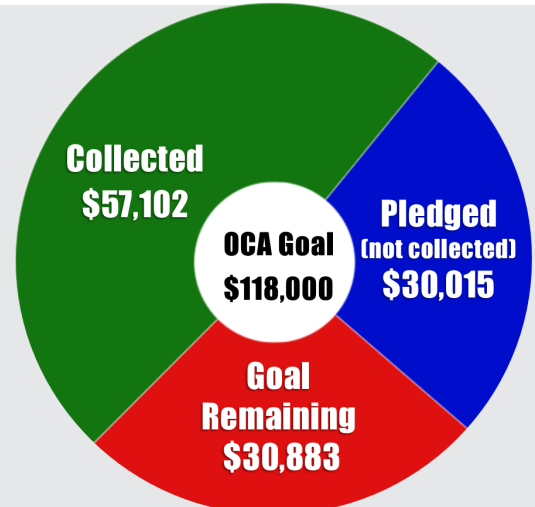

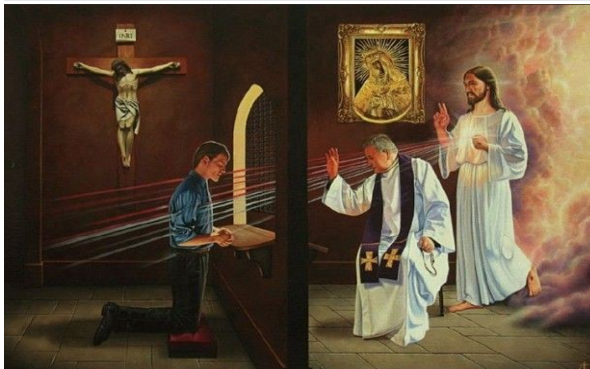

THE SPLENDOR OF OUR FAITH

GREAT INTELLECTUALS-PART III

Etymology and Definition

Last week we learned that to be intellectual is more than simply being a brainiac or a know-it-all. Rather, a person who is intellectual is one who engages reality as a whole. Modern scientism eschews any talk about the transcendent or heavenly. Yet, *this has not stopped humanity from being drawn to these realities*. Modern scientism does not look at reality as a whole, but only in a very small and superficial part. The physical realm is only a section of existence. Human persons are composed of body *and soul*. Thus, there is a physical and spiritual component to our existence. We are beings who are simultaneously in the world, but not purely worldly. We have appetites and desires of the flesh, *but also appetites and desires of the soul*. What is seen and empirically proven is not enough for us; we want more. One of the major problems in contemporary society is that we live as if these spiritual appetites are non-existent. So, we attempt to satiate spiritual realities with physical things. One of the most common manifestations of this fact nowadays is the deep ache for self-identity, purpose and relationship which is so often malnourished by superficialities; Netflix binges, hours on Facebook, video games, drug-abuse, pornography...all of these things are used to fill a whole in the heart. I remember once watching a sunset and being brought to tears by its beauty. Why? Why did a big ball of hydrogen millions of miles away cause me to cry. Science would say that it was merely the activity of chemical reactions in my brain. But is that satisfactory? Is that also why the poet writes of the blue-jay's song or the musician composes a hymn professing his love for his beloved? Is that why Michelangelo carved the *Pieta* or Shakespeare penned *Hamlet*? Science has no answer for these realities because *they are beyond the scientific*. The most intelligent person, therefore, is the one who can recognize the importance of *both the physical and spiritual realm of existence*. They are people who appreciate the seriousness of humanity's questions *on all levels*. Whereas scientific atheism or agnosticism fails, rejects or refuses questions outright, Catholicism takes every longing of the human heart into consideration dedicating thousands of years of study and contemplation upon the most fundamental questions of humanity. Only in the Catholic Church can you find a nun who fed the poor while pioneering the field of computer science such as Sr. Mary Kenneth or a priest who says Mass in the morning and invents the Big-Bang Theory in the afternoon such as Fr. Georges Lemaître. These are people who live to the fullness of their humanity, they are truly intelligent people because they are people who have encountered the font of all wisdom: Jesus Christ the Lord.

GRANDES INTELLECTUALES-3º PARTE

Etimología y Definición

La semana pasada aprendimos que ser intelectual es más que simplemente ser un cerebritito o un sabelotodo. Más bien, una persona que es intelectual es aquella que se engrana y participa en la realidad como un todo. El cientificismo moderno evita hablar de lo trascendente o celestial. Sin embargo, *esto no ha impedido que la humanidad sea atraída por estas realidades*. El cientificismo moderno no ve la realidad como un todo, sino sólo en una parte muy pequeña y superficial. El campo físico es sólo una sección de la existencia. Los humanos están compuestos de cuerpo *y alma*. Así, hay un componente físico y espiritual en nuestra existencia. Somos seres que estamos simultáneamente en el mundo, pero no puramente mundanos. Tenemos apetitos y deseos de la carne, *pero también anhelos y deseos del alma*. Lo que se ve y se demuestra empíricamente no es suficiente para nosotros; queremos más. Uno de los mayores problemas de la sociedad contemporánea es que vivimos como si estos anhelos espirituales no existieran. Entonces, intentamos saciar las realidades espirituales con cosas físicas. Una de las manifestaciones más comunes de esto hoy en día es el profundo anhelo por la auto identidad, el propósito y la relación que tan a menudo se mal nutre de superficialidades. Maratones de Netflix, horas en Facebook, juegos de video, abuso de drogas, pornografía... todas estas cosas son utilizadas para llenar un vacío en el corazón. Recuerdo una vez que vi una puesta del sol y me puse a llorar por su belleza. ¿Por qué? ¿Por qué una gran bola de hidrógeno lejos a millones de millas me hizo llorar? La ciencia diría que fue simplemente la actividad de las reacciones químicas en mi cerebro. ¿Pero es satisfactorio? ¿Es también por eso que el poeta escribe la canción del arrendajo azul o el músico compone un himno profesando su amor por su amada? ¿Es por eso que Miguel Ángel esculpió la *Pieta* o Shakespeare escribió *Hamlet*? La ciencia no tiene respuesta para estas realidades porque *están más allá de lo científico*. La persona más inteligente, por lo tanto, es la que puede reconocer la importancia de *los campos físico y espiritual de la existencia*. Son personas que aprecian la seriedad de las cuestiones y temas de la humanidad *en todos los niveles*. Mientras que el ateísmo científico o el agnosticismo fracasan, rechazan o refutan preguntas y cuestiones en definitivo, el catolicismo lleva en cuenta todos los anhelos del corazón humano, dedicando miles de años de estudio y contemplación a las cuestiones más fundamentales de la humanidad. Sólo en la Iglesia Católica se puede encontrar una monja que alimentaba a los pobres mientras era pionera en el campo de la informática, como la Hermana Mary Kenneth, o a un sacerdote que dice misa por la mañana e inventa la teoría del Big Bang por la tarde, como el P. Georges Lemaître. Estas son personas que viven a la plenitud de su humanidad, son personas verdaderamente inteligentes porque son personas que han encontrado la fuente de toda sabiduría: Jesucristo el Señor.
