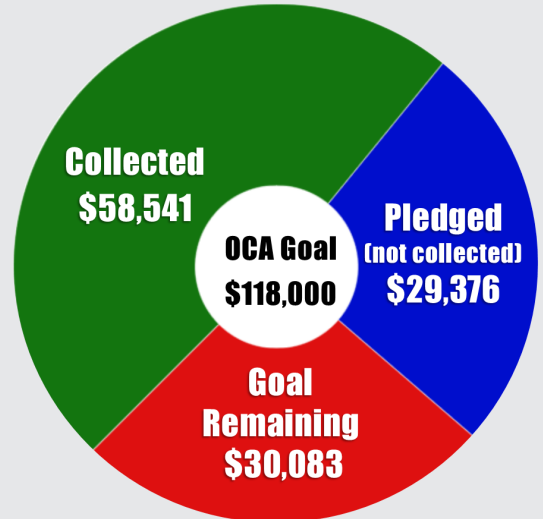

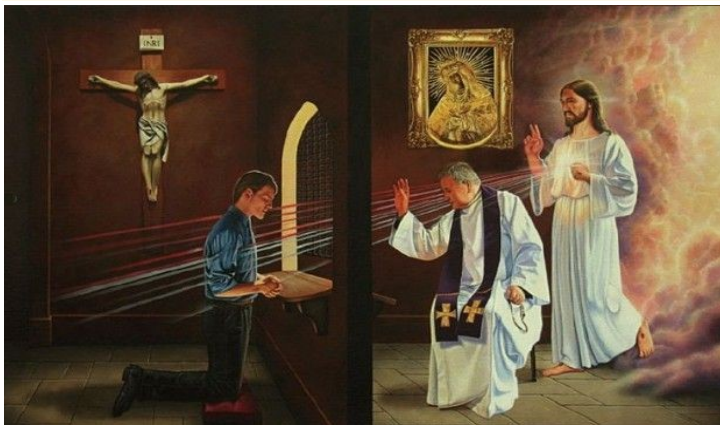

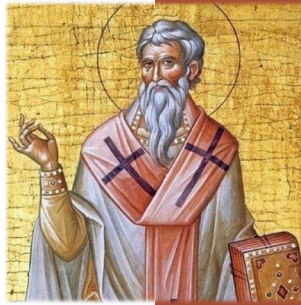


THE SPLENDOR OF OUR FAITH

GREAT INTELLECTUALS — *St. Irenaeus of Lyons*

Born in Smyrna (modern-day Turkey) around the year 135AD, St. Irenaeus of Lyons was raised in a Christian family. As a young man, he was a student of St. Polycarp, the bishop of Smyrna, who himself was a disciple of St. John the Apostle. He was deeply inspired by Polycarp's preaching and stories, all of which were first-hand accounts received from the Apostle John. Eventually, Irenaeus made his way to the region of Gaul in modern-day France where he became a priest in the city of Lyons. In 177AD, he was sent to Rome with a message for Pope Eleutherius. During his time away, the Roman Emperor Marcus Aurelius began a persecution of Catholics in Lyons leading to the death of many Christians including the 90 year-old bishop of Lyons. Upon his return home, Irenaeus was named the new bishop and immediately began re-building the persecuted community by his personal holiness, zealous preaching, brilliant theological mind and selfless charity. He wrote several books. One of his most important works is entitled *Against Heresies (Adversus Haereses)*. This book is vital to Western history on numerous accounts. It represents one of the first works of theology which seeks to present a cohesive and unified vision of Christianity and its teachings. This would become a model of religious thought for many centuries to come. Yet, the most important contribution of St. Irenaeus is his defense of the inherent goodness of the created world. At this time, there were a group of heretics called the Gnostics who asserted that matter, meaning all of created being, was evil. In particular, the human body was highly detested as something to be despised and rejected. St. Irenaeus combatted this gross teaching by a single brilliant phrase which continues to be a reference point for anthropology: "The glory of God is man fully alive!" In contradiction to the Gnostics, Irenaeus upheld the inherent dignity of the human person by referencing humanity to divinity. God's greatest glory is when we as human persons live our lives to their fullest potential, *body and soul*. With these words, the bishop of Lyons is preserving the value of creation. This would be crucial to the future of Western civilization especially in regards to the natural sciences and medicine. It was the Catholic Church's teaching on the dignity of the world and the human person which led to the blossoming of research in ways to protect and preserve them. If the world is beautiful, then that means it is worth understanding and exploring. If humanity is good, than that means every human being is worth respecting and saving. In the end, St. Irenaeus helped protect the West from becoming a civilization that was anti-human and hedonistic. If only we could re-learn some of his lessons today...



EL ESPLENDOR DE NUESTRA FE

GRANDES INTELECTUALES — *San Ireneo de Lyon*

Nacido en Esmirna (actualmente Turquía) alrededor del año 135 dC, San Ireneo de Lyon fue criado en una familia cristiana. De joven fue alumno de San Policarpo, obispo de Esmirna, discípulo del Apóstol San Juan. Fue inspirado profundamente por la predicación y las historias de Policarpo, todas las cuales eran relatos de primera mano recibidos del Apóstol Juan. Eventualmente, Ireneo se dirigió a la región de Galia, en lo que ahora es Francia, donde se convirtió en sacerdote en la ciudad de Lyon. En 177 dC, fue enviado a Roma con un mensaje para el Papa Eleuterio. Durante su ausencia, el emperador romano Marco Aurelio empezó una persecución a los católicos en Lyon que llevó a la muerte de muchos cristianos, entre ellos el obispo de Lyon que tenía 90 años de edad. Al regresar a Lyon, Ireneo fue nombrado el nuevo obispo e empezó inmediatamente a reconstruir la comunidad perseguida por su santidad personal, su predicación fervorosa, su brillante mente teológica y su caridad generosa. Escribió varios libros. Una de sus obras más importantes se titula *Contra las Herejías (Adversus Haereses)*. Este libro es crucial para la historia occidental en numerosos aspectos. Representa una de las primeras obras de teología que busca presentar una visión cohesiva y unificada del cristianismo y sus enseñanzas. Esto se convertiría en un modelo de pensamiento religioso por muchos siglos. Sin embargo, la contribución más importante de San Ireneo es su defensa de la bondad inherente del mundo creado. En aquel tiempo, había un grupo de herejes llamados los gnósticos que afirmaban que la materia, es decir, todo ser creado, era malo. En particular, el cuerpo humano era altamente detestado como algo que debía ser despreciado y rechazado. San Ireneo combatió esta enseñanza inculta con una sola frase brillante que sigue siendo un punto de referencia para la antropología: "¡La gloria de Dios es el hombre plenamente vivo!" En contradicción con los gnósticos, Ireneo defendió la dignidad inherente de la persona humana al referir la humanidad a la divinidad. La mayor gloria de Dios es cuando nosotros, como personas humanas, vivimos nuestras vidas a su potencial máximo, en *cuerpo y alma*. Con estas palabras, el obispo de Lyon preserva el valor de la creación. Esto sería crucial para el futuro de la civilización occidental, especialmente con respecto a las ciencias naturales y la medicina. Fue la enseñanza de la Iglesia Católica sobre la dignidad del mundo y de la persona humana que llevó al florecimiento del estudio para protegerla y preservarla. Si el mundo es hermoso, entonces significa que vale la pena entenderlo y explorarlo. Si la humanidad es buena, entonces significa que cada ser humano merece ser respetado y salvado. En fin, San Ireneo ayudó a proteger al Occidente de convertirse en una civilización antihumana y hedonista. Si tan sólo pudiéramos volver a aprender algunas de sus enseñanzas hoy ...
